



As you recall a major public consultation exercise we carried out in June 2009 looking at various strategic options

namely

Refurbishment of existing hall

New hall on current site

New hall on new site

Of those three options the community's preference was to build a new hall on the existing site

The design before you is the next step in that process and takes on board the consultation responses that were received from user groups, the general public and members of the Hall Committee

The design has evolved considerably since the initial designs were put up in the Memorial Hall and we would like to take this opportunity via these boards to explain how the design has developed.

Our brief was to design an environmentally responsible multi-purpose community hall capable of accommodating as wide a range of user groups and functions as possible within the budget constraints/available funding and the size of the site.

We wanted to create a building that is as flexible as possible so it can respond to both current needs and also the needs of future generations.

We are all aware of the limitations of the current hall and we have tried to create a new community centre that addresses those shortcomings.
