As we enter a second period of lockdown in England we will continue to operate within the Government's guidelines for veterinary practices. We will continue to provide veterinary care and treatment and will continue with the procedures put in place to minimise the risk and to protect the wellbeing of our team, and you, our clients. The overall message of the national lockdown is to stay at home although members of the public are permitted to travel to access veterinary services. We will assess cases in that context and, in some cases, it will be appropriate to delay seeing a pet for the duration of the lockdown. We would ask that you respect our decision in these cases. If your pet is already booked in for an appointment / procedure one of our team will contact you and discuss options, please bear with us as we work through the lists! We will continue to offer phone triage consultations as we did in the previous lock down, these will be chargeable and payment will be taken at the time of booking, before the vet phones you. As before if then deemed necessary an appointment will be booked at one of our practices. As the Welsh restrictions are easing on Monday 9th Nov we are able to make routine appointments for our Welsh clients at our Presteigne branch, as available. ...from The Royal Oak. As the firebreak ends this weekend we prepare to reopen our doors again. We will reopen at 4pm this Monday. Due to the current climate, after this first week back we have taken the decision to close on Mondays for the time being.

The new guidelines for pubs have at last been released and here is a brief breakdown of the new guidelines to be in place:

* Please wait behind the barriers at the bar until you are meet and greeted by a member of staff. The track and trace form will be on the bar in the waiting area for all patrons to sign in.

- * It is now a maximum of 4 people per table unless all visitors in your group are from the same household. If from the same household then that number is unlimited to allow families to visit together.
- * Only patrons living in Wales are allowed to visit the pub during the English lockdown.
- * New guidelines recommend you to pre book tables and for specified time periods. Walk ins will be allowed if we're not at capacity.
- * Social distancing of tables, sanitiser stations and many of the other previous rules will still be in place.
- * The updated rules will yet again be placed on the tables so you can get acquainted with them. Please adhere to the government guidelines to enable a safe environment for all. Thank you for your cooperation!

...from Reverend Hollinghurst. Dear Friends. You will probably be aware by now that recent announcements by the English and Welsh Governments are having a major impact on church life on both sides of the border - and, therefore, for the churches in our Benefice. As far as I understand it, (and as it stands today - who knows what will happen tomorrow?!) the situation is as follows...

Due to the English lockdown ... there can be no Sunday services in Kinsham, Lingen or Knill until the 9.30 Morning Prayer service at Lingen on December 6th. Hence, although the church buildings can be left open for private prayer, sadly the Holy Communion BCP scheduled for Knill on Sunday Nov 8th, the Holy Communion CW scheduled for Lingen on November 15th and the Morning Prayer BCP scheduled for Kinsham on November 22nd are all cancelled. When the Welsh lockdown ends on Monday November 9th ... Sunday services can restart in Presteigne and Discoed and churches can reopen for private prayer. Hence, although the Remembrance Sunday service scheduled for Presteigne on November 8th remains cancelled there will be a Holy Communion BCP in Presteigne on November 15th, a Morning Service CW in Presteigne and a HCCW in Discoed on November 22nd, a Special Service for Advent in Presteigne on November 29th, and a Holy Communion CW in Presteigne on December 6th. I have to remind church members in England that, regrettably, travel across the border to attend worship in Presteigne or Discoed is not permissible under Welsh Government regulations. I'm really sorry and very sad about the closures but there is very little we can do about it. I understand that representations are being made to the Westminster Government by the leaders of various Christian denominations and of other faiths, so the situation may change in England. I will be in touch with you again if there is a change of heart and people of faith are once again allowed to freely practice their religious duties. Of course, I'll be sending out services and readings every weekend (by email and on paper) as before, but if you haven't been receiving these and would like to do so, please get in touch. The residents and subscribers of waste collections from the garden are reminded that there are only a few weeks of waste collections from the garden left for 2020. The service, which starts in March every year, is collecting waste from the garden every fortnight until the first week of December. ...from Powys CC. Poultry keepers in Powys are warned and asked to stay vigilant about avian influenza after two cases were recently confirmed in the UK. Despite the overall risk being low, two different strains of bird flu were confirmed at a premises in Cheshire and at a small commercial premises in Kent this week. Control measures have been put in place in both areas, but bird keepers in Powys are being urged to ensure the necessary biosecurity measures are maintained to help reduce the likelihood of local infections. The UK Government's Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs have said the risk of bird flu occurring in the UK is 'medium' in wild birds, and 'low' in poultry, provided there's a good standard of biosecurity. Please keep an eye out for any signs of bird disease and if found, report it immediately to the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) on 0300 303 8268.
