TOWN COUNCIL NEWS

- ...Allotments thought of growing your own fruit and veg but don't have the space? Did you know that the Town Council has an allotment site at the bottom of Went's Meadow? Tenancy renewals are due in March so now is the time to put your name on the waiting list if you are interested. A plot is currently available to let for the coming year. - ...Grant for Improving Shop Fronts, High Streets in Powys. The Welsh Government Transforming Towns funding is currently available for towns across Mid Wales to fund various works in town centres to improve and secure the future of High Streets in our towns. The P&N Town Council has identified a section of the grant allocation for improving shop fronts via painting, replacement/repair of rotten windows, repair/repaint of doors etc. Welsh Government aim to improve obvious sections/groups of High Streets so a group application is likely to be more successful than individual applications. The grant does not just cover ground level but all storeys of a building. If an individual business applies then a 45% grant of the total cost is claimable but the Town Council can apply for a group of properties and if this is done then a

grant of 70% is payable. Businesses that are included in a joint application will need to include brief details on how they would fund their section of the costs for the works. It will be necessary to get quotes for any works to submit with an application. The minimum level of eligible project costs that can be considered is £35,000 ex VAT (per application) in any one town and the maximum is £250,000. The amount of any grant offered will be assessed on an individual project basis and works will be considered for eligibility via an expression of interest form which this Council would complete. The latest full application date is 26th April this year with the deadline for completion of any works being 31st December 2024 so time is of the essence. The Town Council would like to hear from anyone interested in applying for a grant and if there is sufficient interest will arrange a meeting for all interested parties to attend in order to discuss the way forward. The Grant Officer at the County Council is willing to attend to answer any questions. There is also a commercial improvement grant which businesses can apply for direct and which aims to restore derelict/ disused buildings. ...Fake Health Lottery letters. Google searches for scam Health Lottery letters have spiked these last few weeks. These sneaky 'lottery award-winning claim notification' letters claim recipients have won as much as £750,000 in the Health Lottery. However, if you call to claim the prize, you will be targeted by fraudsters trying to steal your personal and financial information. It's important to note that the Health Lottery never sends letters to its winners. Go to the Which? website to see examples of these scams, along with a Royal Mail form that you can use to report them..

We reached a stage where we felt that we were far enough along to risk the rest and start the work. Pete quickly stripped the old temporary cover off the Dragon and sent the skeleton off for cleaning and galvanising. When returned to the workshop it was gleaming silver and already beautiful, but the construction of the permanent skin then had to be turned from the drawing board to reality. Uncharted territory but slowly progress was made. An ingenious and time consuming mixture of cheesecloth, fibreglass matting, resin and peel ply were used to gently cover the frame and reveal the shape. Hundreds of hours work by Pete and friends through zero temperatures and every weather winter can throw. After much fine tuning to the required finish, it is almost ready to paint. We are now discussing the logistics of the return to behind the Corton roundabout, or as we refer to it The Dragon Roundabout. Within the belly of the Dragon will be a time capsule incorporating the names of all the donors (where known) including the long list of lovely suppliers who have also contributed, along with the story up to the point of return. We intend to share the date of the return (this Spring) as soon as it is confirmed to ensure if anyone wishes to be around they will be very welcome. Keep an eye out for updates
