Take a Step to #MoveTheDate. We know it can be overwhelming to think about how your personal Footprint contributes to global overshoot. The truth is, you can take steps to chip away at your impact on the planet. Join Freegle (go here to do that: https://www.ilovefreegle.org) to make sure you pass on your unwanted stuff to be reused and so you can find things you do need for free in your local area. This easy behaviour change reduces the new raw materials required and the

carbon emissions associated with making, transporting and selling new stuff. #reuse also means we avoid unnecessary waste. Good for people and planet!

...from Ken Rodmell. Brocchi's Cluster aka The Coathanger - I hope you found a break in the clouds in which to see double star Albireo (issue 198) but don't worry if you didn't - it will still be there tonight! Today we'll stick around inside the Summer Triangle, close to Albireo and seek out a wonderful pattern of stars forming a straight line and a question mark that really does mimic a coathanger! Astronomers categorise brightness by Magnitude, a logarithmic scale placing Venus around minus four, Vega around Zero and our naked-eye limit around plus six. You'll definitely need binoculars to bag the Coathanger because, for the most part, its stars lie just beyond naked-eye perception at around plus 7. Do look up 'Brocchi's Cluster' on Wikipedia for some inspirational pictures, further info and a very helpful finder chart to take you there.

...consultation on changes to the Highway Code. There are 3 main interesting changes proposed through this consultation:

* introducing a hierarchy of road users which ensures that those road users who can do the greatest harm have the greatest responsibility to reduce the danger or threat they may pose to others

* clarifying existing rules on pedestrian priority on pavements and that drivers and riders should give way to pedestrians crossing or waiting to cross the road

... from the Powys Family Information Service. Child Care Offer Revised Date for Autumn term. With thanks to the efficiency of the team in Ceredigion we can confirm a revised date for applications for children who were born between the 1st of April 2017 – 31st August 2017. Children who were born during this time can now apply sooner than previously advised...from 9th of September instead of the 21st September. Please allow up to 28 days for your application to be processed. If a parent uses childcare before their application is approved, the parent is liable for paying the costs of the childcare and no childcare funding can be backdated to account for the period before an application is approved. Parents/Carers must have the following information available in the format of a photo or electronically ready to upload as part of their application *Child's birth certificate *Proof of address (Council Tax Bill or Utility bill dated within the last 3 months) *Payslips - 3 most recent monthly payslips for each parent or if paid weekly each week for the last 3 months *If self-employed your most recent Self-Assessment Tax Return *If parents are in new employment and do not have a payslip. They must have a copy of their contract or a letter from the employer confirming the income and hours worked.
