Calling Wildflower Lovers & Home Educators....Would you like to help make Presteigne's grass verges a flowery haven to attract bees, butterflies and other pollinating insects? A group of Presteigne residents would like to encourage a new generation of wildflower fans. Discussion with Powys CC is ongoing, but a map has been produced showing some areas designated to be cut later than usual to allow wild flowers to seed and multiply. This will provide food for and encourage the bees, butterflies and other beneficial insects vital to pollinate the food that we ourselves eat. You could get to know your wildflowers better by looking for 20 wild flowers to be found in the grass verges below the Warden, using this Wildflower Verges flier and map. Info: felt@cooptel.net

...from PCC. Household waste and recycling centres (HWRC) in Powys are due to reopen, with significant restrictions, from Tuesday 26 May. In conjunction with our contractors, Potter Group, all Welsh local authorities and Welsh Government, HWRCs across Powys will open for essential use only. This essential use is for residents who have accumulated waste which cannot be collected through the normal kerbside collection service and which cannot be stored safely at home until the lockdown

restrictions are eased. Non-essential use puts yourself, other members of the public and our staff at risk from spreading the virus. It is very important that residents check the website for up-to-date information and familiarise themselves with the restrictions in place at the HWRC before traveling." ...from Presteigne Freegle. We'll be open for freegling again on the 26th May. The re-opening of the Presteigne group was linked to the re-opening of the HWRCs by PCC (Herefordshire and Shropshire have reopened already). So, if you have taken the opportunity of lockdown to tidy the kids' bedrooms, the garage, the attic and the garden shed, and are now wondering what to do with all the stuff you no longer need, you'll be pleased to see this announcement. We know freegling will be immensely useful right now, and government advice is to use online platforms such as ours rather than go to tips or recycling centres. You can offer stuff now, we'll keep your posts 'on hold', and then let members know about them on the 26th. That way you can still declutter while you're stuck at home over the next couple of weeks. We do not want to encourage unnecessary travel and we'd like everyone to stay safe - so we'll be sending out an Admin message before the 26th with updated COVID-19 guidelines for freegling.

...from HM Treasury. The Self-Employment Income Support Scheme opens for applications today, weeks ahead of schedule. From 8am this morning self-employed individuals or members of partnerships whose business has been adversely affected by coronavirus will be able to apply for a Self-Employment Income Support Scheme (SEISS) grant worth 80% of their average monthly trading profits, to be paid in a single instalment covering three months and capped at £7,500 – expected to land in bank accounts by 25 May, or within six days of a completed claim.
