- ...from Ken Rodmell Mercury viewing opportunity! Relatively few people have ever seen our innermost planet, Mercury, but the next few days offer a chance to do just that. You'll need patience, a clear horizon to the west and to identify brilliant Venus as a starting point. Binoculars should pick up Mercury in the vicinity from around 9:30 pm, becoming a naked-eye object around 10:00 pm. It will appear far smaller than Venus and significantly dimmer. Do check online for Mercury's precise relationship to Venus as changes occur markedly from day to day. Never point your binoculars at the sun!

- ...from Recycle Now. PPE such as disposable gloves and face masks should not be put into your recycling. Please dispose of them safely by putting them in your general waste bin. If wearing a cloth face covering in public, wash it after every use in line with manufacturer's instructions.
- ...from Powys County Council. Latest news: Test, Trace, Protect partnership launches in Powys. Strong partnership working between Powys Teaching Health Board and Powys County Council means that the county is well-place to deliver the Welsh Government's new Test Trace Protect strategy. The Test Trace Protect sets out the strategy for Wales for testing the public, tracing the spread of Coronavirus, helping to the country to relax lockdown restrictions. The strategy is due to be launched in Powys next week. It will work by:
- ldentifying those who have symptoms consistent with COVID-19, enabling them to be tested while isolating from wider family, friends and their community.
- Tracing those individuals who have been in close contact with the symptomatic person, requiring them to take precautions and self-isolate (for 14 days).
- Providing advice and guidance, particularly where the symptomatic individual or their contacts are vulnerable or at greater risk.
- Ensuring that if the individual tests negative and the symptoms are not due to coronavirus, individuals and their contacts can get back to their normal routines as soon as possible.

...from Powys County Council. Urgent need for more home care workers - we are urgently recruiting 30 more home care workers to help residents remain independent in their own homes and communities. The posts – domiciliary care assistants – are available across Powys and will be fixed term for six months. The council requires extra staff as a number of the workforce are currently shielding or socially isolating with some 4.7% of the whole council workforce currently unavailable. More information about the jobs can be found at https://crowd.in/EESbqC. The jobs are being offered as 25 hour a week positions for the next 6 months. The closing date for applications is Wednesday June 10.
