#### **SCAM ALERT**

- ...(ed.) if you receive an email with sender 'NEWS', beware, it's not from PACDG or the Community News!! The email asks you to download today and adds a strange link. This is a phish or maybe even malware. Don't open just delete!
- ...Covid-19 scammers are hard at work so be on your guard. NHS UK says "If you're contacted by the NHS Test and Trace service, you will NOT be asked to provide any passwords, bank account details or pin numbers. The team will call from: 0300 013 5000 OR send a text message from "NHS". - ...(ed.) and beware the 'subscribe' scammers. People are receiving phishing texts and emails congratulating them for signing up to a fictional newsletter or information emails. Some of these are obvious scams showing Cyrillic or Urdu text or poor English but others are initially convincing. The temptation is to click an 'unsubscribe' link or to change your 'preferences' or look at the newsletter. DON'T! Just delete without opening.

With lockdown measures easing, there are plenty of new opportunities for 'R' to increase. As the weather improves and children and teachers head back to school, more people will come into contact with one another. The risk of new COVID hotspots emerging is also likely to increase without adequate monitoring. Our app is a crucial early detection tool to understand if there is a risk of a second wave of the virus. It's is more important than ever that you keep logging daily using our app to help us to detect new COVID hotspots earlier. Protect your community as lockdown lifts by reporting for yourself and behalf of your children to stop the spread of new infections quicker. We would also like to encourage you to share the app with schools, parent's associations, and other organisations within your community. The more of us there are using the app daily, the more accurately and quickly we will be able to identify potential hotspots. How might I keep my kids safe as they return to school?
