SCAM ALERT

Bank security scam alert! A reminder not to respond to unexpected calls from anyone claiming to be from your bank's security team, alerting you to a possible theft from your account. One of our readers recently received a call purporting to be from 'Visa Santander', stating that someone was trying to transfer £600 from their account to a bank in California, and recommending that they should install a security system on their computer in order to prevent this. The caller did not ask for any bank details or any other information, so our reader presumed they were genuine and it was some time before they realised they were being tricked into downloading a software programme called Anydesk that would have provided access to a lot of their data. A phone call to their bank revealed that the fraudsters had indeed been able to access our reader's account, but fortunately the bank's own security systems had prevented them from withdrawing any money.

The latest weekly report from the Office for National Statistics has been published today and sadly confirms that 92 Powys residents have died where COVID19 was mentioned on their death certificate. Their report identifies 37 deaths in hospitals in Wales and England, 46 deaths in care homes and 9 in the person's home. - ...from Powys CC. Activity sessions for children in Powys will be held during the summer holidays, the county council has said. Powys County Council has arranged its Children's Summer Sessions, which will be held every weekday afternoon from Monday, July 27 to Friday, August 26. The sessions will take place at eight venues across the county and are aged for children aged five to 16. The council is reminding parents who are key workers that the emergency childcare provision currently provided by schools and five leisure centres across the county will end of Friday, July 24. The sessions, which will run in line with Welsh Government Covid-19 guidance, will be held Monday to Friday from 1:30-4:30pm. Places will be limited so parents must book their child's place online. The sessions will be held at Freedom Leisure Centres in Brecon, Newtown, Rhayader, Welshpool and Ystradgynlais as well Ysgol Bro Hyddgen (secondary campus), Llandrindod Wells Youth Centre and Knighton Primary School.
