...Wilson Terrace Play Area. In case you hadn't noticed, the Wilson Terrace play area has been re-opened by PCC. The area has been deep cleaned and some equipment (e.g. a swing seat) temporarily removed to aid social distancing. There are advisory notices on the entrances which ask parents, guardians and carers to observe the following so that children can enjoy safe play:

- · Supervise children when using the play area.
- Do not enter if you have any COVID 19 symptoms.
- Observe social distancing: Only one household should use an item of play equipment at any one time. The number of people (children and adults) to be in the play area at any one time is shown on the gates please respect this and comply.
- Make sure that children wash or sanitise their hands before and after using the play equipment and avoid touching their faces.
- · Do not bring food or drink into the play area.

- ...from Powys CC. Latest news: Plans for September school return. Work to plan a safe and organised return for all pupils in September is ongoing, Powys County Council has said. The council is working with all its schools to ensure that all pupils will return safely after the summer holidays. Although approaches will vary among schools, all pupils will be able to resume full time education by September 14, in line with the recent Welsh Government announcement. Following discussions with headteachers and teaching unions, the following arrangements for Powys schools will be:
- 1st September: Staff only day Planning and preparation for the re-opening of schools following Coronavirus
- 2nd September: Staff only day Planning and preparation for the re-opening of schools following Coronavirus
- 3rd to 11th September: Welcoming children and young people back to school, using a "phased return" approach with specific timetables designed for particular cohorts / years to return on different days. Given the current position, the council believes that a "phased return" approach

will be the most effective for the county, with each school aiming to welcome all children back to school by 10/09/20 or 11/09/20.

14th September: All schools open for all children. Headteachers will contact parents or guardians with the specific details of their children's school.
