OTHER INFORMATION

...from Powys CC and ER Day Centre. ERHS helping shielding and isolated residents. There has been a tremendous contribution from volunteers in the community during this pandemic, providing support and supplies to people who are shielding or self-isolating. One group which has been looking after its community is East Radnor Home Support (ERHS) East Radnorshire Day Centre, which has been helping people in Presteigne and Knighton with prescriptions, essential shopping, and meals-on-wheels, as well as making welfare telephone calls. The group has been managed through its 24-hour emergency response arrangements, which have been funded by Powys County Council, using the Welsh Government's Integrated Care Funds. This service, amongst other roles, delivers a 24-hour emergency response for personal and panic alarms. Cllr. Beverley Baynham is chief officer with ERHS, which has six staff, and she explained: "The service was in place before the Covid-19 pandemic, but we've been wellplaced to respond to the challenges of lockdown. "We offer a 24-hour emergency response service: if someone has a fall or is in distress in any way we have a team of on-call staff who can go out to them, taking PPE and social distancing requirements into account. "We've been really pleased that we've been able to help out. There are some 400 people in the area who we are supporting and while the service is not unique - for example there is a similar service in Rhayader - it does show the value of having services like us in place." She explained that if the team, which is based at the East Radnor Day Centre in Presteigne, is not able to help, they act

as a signposting service and help local people get in touch with specialists. And they recently took on a warden service for accommodation in the town for elderly and vulnerable people. You can find out more about ERHS: https://crowd.in/5a9Get

...from The Bracken Trust Cancer Support Centre (a Registered Charity based in Llandrindod Wells. It supports anyone affected by cancer (including those who have experienced a bereavement) in the Mid Wales and border areas. It provides information, advice, complementary therapies, counselling and a range of activities which encourage people to manage their condition and maintain an excellent quality of life. During the Covid-19 lockdown, staff have been unable to provide face to face contact; however, the nursing and counselling staff have continued to provide telephone and / or face to face support via electronic communication methods (depending on the patient's preference). This level of support will continue for the foreseeable future. We are slowly opening The Trust and are currently offering face to face support to specific groups of patients (by appointment only). We are also accepting new and self-referrals and are following strict processes to maximise the safety of staff and visitors. We plan to extend face to face support to all patients over the next few weeks, as restrictions from Welsh Government lift, and hopefully extend those opportunities to our hubs in Llanwrtyd Wells, Llanidloes and Knighton.

- ...Road closures on the route to Hereford. Please note that Herefordshire CC plan major roadworks between 24th August and 30th October to install a roundabout to replace the existing Lawton crossroads where the A4110 Mortimers Cross-Hereford road crosses the B4529 Eardisland-Leominster road. This will involve complete road closures for periods in rotation, with 3-way traffic lights on the other roads. So best to use the Kington or Lyonshall routes, or otherwise check ahead on the Herefordshire CC Highways website before taking the Mortimers Cross route to/from Hereford. The work won't affect your journey to Leominster if you use the Cobnash or Lucton routes. - ...from Powys CC / Traffic Wales. Please note an Emergency Road Closure on the B4355 at Lloyney (the road from Knighton towards Newtown) is in place from the 13 Aug 1 Sep 2020 (24Hr Restriction) on behalf of Powys County Council, while they do works to a collapsed culvert.
- ...from Presteigne Little Peoples Playgroup and Powys Family Information Service. Childcare offer Information. Families who were eligible for the offer prior to the 31st of March, the childcare team are in the process of gathering any information that requires updating from those families. You will not need to complete a new application. Expect an email in the coming days to update any necessary information. Respond as soon as possible so as not to delay.

- ...from Powys CC. Businesses can now apply to Powys County Council for permission to operate on pavements, public areas and reclaimed highways to help them get back up and running. The coronavirus (COVID-19) crisis has had a significant impact on the lives and health of many Powys citizens, but it has also had severe economic consequences. The lockdown had an immediate impact on the way in which our town centres operate, with many businesses being required to close for a significant period of time. With many of these businesses now reopening, we must now ensure our public spaces and town centres are not only safe but also allow local businesses to trade within the guidelines. The approval to use the pavements, available from the council, allows businesses to create an outdoor café style atmosphere, along with providing other services and recreation amenities, on designated areas of the public highway. Every town will be different, with a bespoke plan to maximise the strengths of the area and needs of the businesses. In areas where roads can be fully or partly pedestrianised, pavement licences can be granted to help create open air dining and socialising space for cafes, restaurants, pubs and bars. Each application will be assessed and consulted on its own merits. Businesses must demonstrate that they can operate in within social distancing regulations and highway rules to ensure the safety of customers and other members of the public.
