...from PCC about contact tracing. If it's been confirmed that you've been in close contact with someone who has coronavirus, a contact tracer will call you. Following this call, daily check-ups will be made by text for 14 days to support you through your isolation period. Please note, daily text messages will <u>only</u> be sent from number +447775106684 and will include a title message NHSWALESTTP (English) or GIGCYMRUPOD (Welsh) depending on your selected language of choice. SCAM ALERT

...from Gareth about a TV Licence scam. "As I am 75+ I have applied to renew my TV licence – like many others I suppose – including setting up a new direct debit. A few days ago I received an email purporting to be from TV Licensing claiming that my application could not be processed and inviting me to visit their site in order to sort it out. Obviously I declined this invitation! It is clearly a big scam problem as the real TV licensing phone line directed me immediately to an alert about this issue. They will only contact you by post (not email) in the

event of a problem with all relevant details of your name, address, postcode and reference number." (ed. thanks for the information, Gareth)

- ...from Dyfed Powys Police. We're asking the public to be vigilant in respect of any unexpected calls claiming to be from Dyfed-Powys Police. A resident recently received a telephone call where the caller claimed to be a police officer from Dyfed-Powys Police, and that they were going to be arrested. The call was eventually terminated, but if it had gone on there would have inevitably been a demand for funds. Worryingly, the scammers had gone to great lengths to make it look like the call had come from the force as the non-emergency number to call if you're outside of the force area was displayed on the victim's mobile when it rang– 01267 222020. The scam caller also stated that they were calling from a station local to the victim. Please be aware that if an officer from Dyfed-Powys Police was genuinely trying to contact you via telephone, this 01267 number would not show up. Therefore if you receive a call like this, please do not engage with the caller or carry out any actions they may ask you to do, and instead terminate the call as soon as you become suspicious.
- ...be aware of scam calls pretending to be from the Police Serious Crime Squad telling you your account has been used for a large payment in London or Birmingham etc. and they think this may be fraudulent. It's the phone call that's fraudulent! They may even give you a number to call to check that they're genuine ignore it. Note the numbers, put the phone down and report it.
- ...ed. do you already know about the MidBorder News? The MidBorder News is a quarterly news magazine covering Kington, Presteigne, Knighton and surrounding areas. The amount of Council Tax reduction you can get is worked out by looking at how much money you have coming in, your savings, your personal circumstances and the amount of rent you have to pay. If your household is on a low income, you could receive support towards some or all of your Council Tax bill through the Council Tax Reduction Scheme. If you are receiving the benefits below, you can make an application to have your entitlement assessed and applied to your council tax bill: Job Seekers Allowance; Employment Support Allowance; Pension Credit; Income Support; or you're a low income household. https://en.powys.gov.uk/article/4813/Council-Tax-reductions
