...from the BBC. Local lockdown rules. Coronavirus rules vary depending on whether you live in England, Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland. Millions of people are also affected by extra local restrictions, with England now divided into three tiers: medium, high and very high. Find out what the rules are in your area by entering your postcode on the BBC website https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-54373904. The rules highlighted in the search tool are a selection of the key government restrictions in place in your area. Always check your relevant national and local authority website for more information on the situation where you live. Also check local guidance before travelling to others parts of the UK. All the guidance in our look-up comes from national government and local authority websites (ed. thanks Mags for this information)

ed. everything will now change in Wales with a Covid 'firebreak' from 6pm this Friday for two weeks until start of Monday 9th November - the latest definitive Welsh Government information can be seen here: https://gov.wales/coronavirus-regulations-guidance. The Welsh Government says this:

"Even where something may be allowed, we ask you not to think about whether it is permitted but whether it is truly necessary and sensible. The purpose of this short lockdown is to create a concerted national effort to do everything we can to stop the spread of corononavirus, and every individual contribution to that counts."

And by the way, even if the packet claims so, DISPOSABLE FACE MASKS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE - they are made from mixed materials, contain plastics, and have to be put in your wheelie bin.
