A new Test and Trace Support Payment will be available shortly in both England & Wales.

There is now a legal duty to self-isolate in place from 28 September 2020 if you test positive for coronavirus or are contacted by NHS Test and Trace, with fines for breaches. In response to concerns that people were struggling to self-isolate due to financial constraints, a £500 lump sum support payment will be made available for people on low incomes who cannot work from home and have lost income as a result of self-isolating. The scheme will apply to people notified to self-isolate on or after 28 September, not before that date. Local authorities will be making the payments. Local authorities should have the schemes in place by 12 October. If you are told to self-isolate before then (from the 28 September) you will receive backdated payments, if you are eligible, once the scheme is set up in your local authority.

The criteria for self-isolation payment is:

- have been instructed to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace, either because you have tested positive or are in close contact with a positive case
- are employed or self-employed
- are unable to work from home and will lose income as a result
- are currently receiving Universal Credit, Working Tax Credit (WTC), income-based Employment and Support Allowance, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Income Support, Housing Benefit and/or Pension Credit

People in the same household can each make an individual application to receive the payment, if you each meet the criteria. The Wales First Minister has said that in addition to providing a £500 payment to support people on low incomes, they will make a change to Welsh law to stop employers from making it difficult for employees to self-isolate when they need to do so. ...from the Family Information Service. Childcare and Coronavirus Circuit Break: Children can continue to access their usual childcare provider, and you can travel to provide, access or receive childcare. All childcare providers, including Flying Start childcare, can remain open and offer their normal services, including provision through the half term holidays. This includes childcare providers operating from community centres, places of worship and school sites. Nannies can also continue to provide childcare. The number is free to call 24/7.
