#### **DATES FOR YOUR DIARY & OTHER INFORMATION**

...from Stephen, the Rector of St. Andrew's, Presteigne. Sadly, we are not allowed to hold our Remembrance Sunday Service in St Andrew's Church in Presteigne this year due to the Welsh Lockdown. This is entirely beyond our control and I am deeply saddened and disappointed that this important event in the life of our community may not take place this year. There *will* be a Wreath-Laying Ceremony with a Short Service of Remembrance at the Presteigne War Memorial on Sunday November 8th, **but attendance at this is strictly limited** in accordance with Welsh Government Covid restrictions. The small number of people we are allowed to have at the Ceremony means that attendance must be limited to Officials of the Presteigne Branch of the Royal British Legion and those laying wreaths. **Members of the public are asked to remain at home** to mark this solemn occasion either by keeping the Two-Minute Silence at 11am on your doorstep or by watching the National Remembrance Day Ceremony from the London Cenotaph on the television. But even though we may not mark Remembrance in the usual way this year, please don't forget to support the vital work of the Royal British Legion by buying a poppy.

...from Knighton Royal British Legion ref 2020 Remembrance Sunday and Poppy Appeal. Poppies and Crosses are available at The Banc, Costcutters, JDs Cafe, Black Sheep Cafe and Clock Tower Tea Shop in Prince and Pughs. On Remembrance Sunday there will be no Parade or Standards only a much reduced 11am ceremony to comply with Welsh Government rules and Royal British Legion guidelines. There will be a two minute silence preceded by the Legion Exhortation and followed by the Kohima prayer. The wreaths will be then be laid in the order called by the Parade Marshal. Organisations laying Wreaths are asked to have only the minimum number of members attending the ceremony. All those attending are asked to observe social distancing rules and, if possible, to wear masks. The Local Branch of the RBL appreciate that this much reduced Ceremony will be disappointing to many but hope that this limited Act of Remembrance will still honour the memory of those who served.

Flu injection update: there have been some questions on Facebook about whether the flu injection sessions at The Knighton Community Centre are postponed because of the temporary lockdown. We have checked with Wylcwm Street Surgery and because this is essential health treatment, the flu injection sessions will be continuing as normal during the lockdown and The Knighton Community Centre will be open for the purpose. ...from Powys Teaching Health Board. During the national 'firebreak' period, Flu vaccination appointments are important medical reasons to leave your home. More information at <u>www.beatflu.org</u>. If you are not sure if you are eligible for a free flu vaccine, talk to your doctor or nurse, visit www.nhsdirect.wales.nhs.uk or call NHS Direct Wales on 0845 46 47 (or 111 if available in your area). If you are an adult in a risk group, are pregnant, or are aged 65 or over, you can get your flu vaccine at your GP surgery or at some community pharmacies. If you work in health or social care, ask your employer where to get your free vaccine. Care home staff and domiciliary carers should talk to their community pharmacy about getting a flu vaccine. If your child is in a group at increased risk of becoming very ill if they catch flu, or is aged between 2 and 10 on 31 August 2020, you should be contacted by their GP surgery or school nurse. If you think your child might have missed their vaccine, contact the school nurse if your child is at primary school. If they are not at primary school, contact their GP surgery.
