A member of the Powys public handed over a package containing half a kilo of cannabis to police on Friday, after it was sent to the wrong address. Dyfed Powys Police announced on Twitter that the package was handed in to Presteigne Police Station after being found by a law-abiding citizen. Radnorshire Police tweeted at 4.35pm: "Handed in at Presteigne Police Station today by a member of the public who found this half a kilo of cannabis which will not be on the street today as it was sent to the wrong address!!" Although approximate, half a kilogram of cannabis could hold a potential street value of £3,500.

SCAM ALERT

...please be extra aware about all the email, text and phone scams that are doing the rounds at this time in the run up to Christmas. These often 'confirm' your subscription to Amazon Prime, Netflix etc., or your purchase of something, saying that a chunk of money has been debited to your account and encouraging you to click on a link or press a button to confirm this was your intent, query the payment, or change your preferences. Be very wary - unless you know you did purchase something, don't be tempted to correct a 'mistake' - these are phishing scams - ignore, report and delete !
