...items of interest noted by observers from Wednesday's Town Council (Zoom) Meeting.

- Street light survey PCC reviewing all their lights in Presteigne and Norton to see where they can be turned off or dimmed, and are working with the Dark Skies project, the Town Council and County Councillor Baynham on final decisions. Work to be done in 2021-22 financial year.
- Climate Crisis Town Council report produced by Cllr. Rose Bamford on the TC's work over the last 18 months or so will be put on the Town website and on Facebook, plus probably to press.
- Welsh Water essential work due to start in Wilson Terrace playground and Went's Meadow any day.
- Vehicle damage to herb garden/flower bed in Shoppers Carpark to be put right by PACDG Guerrilla Gardeners and protected by boulder to avoid further damage. Cllr Bennett to supply and deliver boulder if PCC have no objection
- Poor road surfaces Stonewall Hill, Stocken Lane and Stapleton into Presteigne pressure continues by several parties to get repairs done.
- Unauthorised felling of tree on the Warden dispute continuing between PCC and Welsh Water. Tree to replaced and hopefully some compensation sought.
- Xmas lights these will stay up at least to 1st February to add a bit of cheer, and longer through February if insurance is obtained - still t.b.c.
- Large pot hole on Titley road just before The Rodd has now been filled.
- Applications are invited to go on the waiting list for Allotment plots download application form on the Town website www.presteigne.org.uk/town-council.

appointment at a mass vaccination centre then please DO, as this will help us to vaccinate as many people as possible as quickly as possible. With vaccination beginning later this month in GP practices it remains VITAL that as many people as possible continue to take up the invitation for vaccination at mass vaccination centres. This is because mass vaccination centres use the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine, and we have reliable supplies of this in good quantities. The more people who accept the invitation to a mass vaccination centre, the quicker we will be able to vaccinate everyone in Priority Groups 1 to 4 - and then moving into all nine priority groups. ...a reminder on flu from Public Health Wales. This autumn and winter, it's more important than ever to protect your child from flu. All children aged 2-10 (age 31 August 2020) and aged 11-18 with a long term health condition, are eligible for FREE flu vaccine - see www.beatflu.org

SCAM ALERT

...Dyfed-Powys Police is warning the public of a large increase in scam phone calls from fraudsters pretending to be from Amazon staing that £79.97 is owed – but if you don't want to renew, you can cancel Amazon by pressing '1'. Or that there has been unauthorised spending on the account (often over £1,000) and again, the request is to press '1' to go through to the 'Fraud Department'. With any of these types of call, If '1' is pressed, then the scammers will try to get as many personal details as possible from the victim, and then gain access to their bank details. Unfortunately, these criminals are very adept at social engineering. Many people think that the scammers will have a 'foreign' accent, but this is not always the case. For any of these types of call, it is best to hang up, and then check your account online by using the app on your phone, or typing the correct address into your browser and then logging into your account that way and checking. DO NOT follow links if the criminal texts or emails them through – these will normally take you to fake sites that look authentic.

...from Sal. I received a text from the number <u>07719275046</u> telling me that it was Emma and she was in hospital with a broken fibula and to text her back, she is very unlucky as it seems to be happening to the poor soul a lot! I have reported it as spam but thought it would be useful to let everyone know, especially the elder residents of the parish.

...from Full Fact. A series of Facebook posts claim a 14 year-old girl is missing after being pulled into a car. These posts are entirely false and may link to harmful phishing websites.
