#### **TOWN COUNCIL NEWS**

...Latest planning application in: 21/0083/FUL Grid Reference: E:328743 N: 265752 Proposal: Change of use from Barn to a two storey dwelling Site Address: Barn At Ackhill Farm, Presteigne. To be considered at the February meeting of the Town Council.

...Climate Crisis. The Town Council acknowledged the climate crisis in May 2019 and formed a Working Group to produce a policy and initial action plan. It has recently approved a report on the various matters that it has managed to undertake since then. The Council's climate crisis working group will be meeting in the coming weeks to review the Council's policy on climate change, to update it considering further items for the action plan.

I've received emails from two readers over the last week asking if the Kay's site can be used as a solar energy farm - see this item from the TC's Climate Crisis Report "Extensive work was carried out by members of the TC to investigate the possibility of using the old Kaye's factory site as a solar farm to supply the towns electricity. It was discovered that the electricity infrastructure is not currently compatible with this type of project (although in private ownership)."]

#### COVID

...from Powys THB. Covid vaccine appointments for people aged 65-69 are due to take place from mid-February and you will be contacted nearer the time. **BUT we have now opened a secondary reserve list for people age 65-69** who may be able to attend a mass vaccination

centre in Bronllys, Builth Wells or Newtown at short notice - particularly if you may be able to travel safely to a vaccination centre if there is snow. ...Mobile Testing Unit moves to Knighton as part of rolling programme. The rotation of mobile testing units across Powys continues with both units moving to two new locations in Machynlleth and Knighton from Monday 1 February. The Knighton unit will be located in Bowling Green Lane Car Park in Knighton, from 10am-4pm daily. Residents are reminded that mobile testing is by appointment-only and provide a drive-through service. All testing units are available by appointment only for people with symptoms. These are: a new continuous cough, high temperature (fever), loss of or change to sense of smell or taste. Appointments can be booked through the UK Government national booking portal, either online at www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test, by phone on 119, or 18001 119 for people with hearing or speech difficulties. This is also the way to request a home testing kit.

...from NHS UK. The COVID-19 vaccine is free of charge on the NHS. We will never ask for: \* your bank account or card details \*your pin or banking password \*copies of personal documents to prove your identity such as your passport, driving licence, bills or pay slips. If someone does....it's a scam !!! Report by email to <a href="report@phishing.gov.uk">report@phishing.gov.uk</a> or by text to 7726 - and delete or hang up.

...from Helen. Please make others aware. I have just discovered fraudulent activity on my bank account for a very considerable amount of money (despite not losing my card) The Fraud department have advised 'checking my bank account daily' even though I'm not out and about as much as usual spending. I would have spotted sooner and prevented the scammers from getting such a large amount. Other pointers they said 'try not to use ATMs you don't usually use', 'go in branch where possible'. 'On line shopping - check when completing order for the secure padlock sign' etc. And 'report anything that looks suspicious no matter how small'. That's the only way to stop these people. Helen

- ...from Powys Recycles. Registration for the 2021 garden waste recycling collection service is now open. Residents across Powys can now subscribe to this year's easy, clean and simple garden waste recycling collection service offered by PCC, by visiting www.powys.gov.uk/gardenwaste or by calling 01597 827465. The annual subscription of £37, includes the hire of a 240-litre wheeled bin and fortnightly collections of your garden waste between 1 March and the 3 December. With 20 collections, the service works out at less than £2 for each full bin of material collected and recycled. A smaller 120-litre bin is available at a reduced rate for households with small gardens, or compostable garden waste sacks for those who have their residual rubbish collected in purple bags. Residents who already benefited from using the service last year will be contacted shortly to remind them to re-subscribe for another year. Once registered for 2021, they will receive a sticker to place on their green wheeled bin to indicate to the crew that they have signed up for another year. New subscribers to the service will have their green wheeled bin delivered by the council within 10 working days, so make sure you sign up early to benefit from all the scheduled collections starting from the beginning of March. Residents not subscribing to the service will still be able to compost their garden waste at home or take it to one of the five household waste recycling centres in Powys.
