...Powys residents who are asked to self-isolate by the NHS Covid-19 app will be able to apply for a £500 self-isolation payment. Until recently the payment was only offered to people who had been told to stay home by Test and Trace staff operators and did not cover app notifications. As of Friday 5 February app users who are notified for being exposed to the virus can apply for the payment through the app if they meet the eligibility criteria of the main scheme i.e. *Employed or self-employed *Unable to work from home and will lose income as a result of self-isolation *Receiving Universal Credit or another specified benefit. The scheme is designed to ease money worries during self-isolation and includes a discretionary element to support those who are not on benefits but remain at risk of financial hardship. Powys CC began processing self-isolation support in November and will be responsible for administering the new app payments. See PCC's website for full details: https://crowd.in/3f2JfF

Kington Medical Practice PPG. "A number of patients have asked whether any vaccination clinics will be held at the surgery. I have been in touch with Dr McCaffrey and she has explained that although the Astra Zeneca vaccine could be given at the surgery, to do so the Practice would have to cancel other appointments. The advantage of having the vaccination hub in Leominster is that each of the practices in our primary care network only has to contribute a couple of members of staff, who are able jointly to vaccinate 8 people in 5 minutes. Housebound patients are being vaccinated at home. Dr McCaffrey has vaccinated 10 patients which by contrast took 4 hours. The Practice is asking patients to make every effort to attend the Leominster hub, in order to maximise the efficiency of the vaccination programme at the same time as maintaining some semblance of normal surgery activity. This strategy seems to be working - I gather from the BBC news that Herefordshire is currently among the top 5 authorities in England with regard to numbers vaccinated. Livestock worrying continues to be an issue across the Dyfed Powys force area, in Powys alone we dealt with 8 incidents during January, and have had one incident reported so far in February. Incidents occur when dogs are unsupervised, escape from their gardens or when not kept under control when out walking. Livestock worrying results in suffering to the livestock, financial loss and in some circumstances dogs being destroyed. Please ensure dogs are kept secure when at home, or kept on a lead whilst out walking. Stick to footpaths when walking in rural locations, avoid fields and footpaths if livestock is present. Farmers will be 'lambing' now, well in to spring!!
