Disappointing news about the Radnorshire Arms which has lain empty for almost 2 years now - the Mid-Wales Journal for 6th March has reported that an offer by a local business consortium for our historic 17th century hotel has been turned down by the administrators. The MWJ report says that the consortium, made up of eight people many with a personal interest in Presteigne, submitted a 'clean' offer with no conditions but this was rejected by the administrators, who say that they continue in discussions with a number of interested parties, and the property remains on the market. Let's hope this is just a temporary setback......

EMAIL SCAM ALERT !.... some people are receiving emails made to look as if they're from PayPal or from one of the big UK banks (HSBC, Barclays etc) warning you that a suspicious payment of £xxx has been noticed on your account. It goes on to say that if you think the payment is OK then do nothing, but if you think it's fraudulent, then click on the link to cancel the payment. DO NOT CLICK ON ANY LINK - THIS IS AT BEST A PHISHING ATTEMPT AND MAY BE A FINANCIAL SCAM! If you don't use Paypal or it's not your bank then the scam is obvious of course, but some fraudsters are very good at mimicking the real website and the incoming email address. If for some reason you fear it may be genuine (it's not!) then log on to your bank or PayPal account to check. **Never clink a link.** (Thanks to Chris Jones for this alert)

Related to the worldwide Right to Repair movement, this was seen on the BBC News website.... New rules could spell the death of a "throwaway" culture in which products are bought, used briefly, then binned. The regulations will apply to a range of everyday items such as mobile phones, textiles, electronics, batteries, construction and packaging. They will ensure products are designed and manufactured so they last - and so they're repairable if they go wrong. It should mean that your phone lasts longer and proves easier to fix. That may be especially true if the display or the battery needs changing. It's part of a worldwide movement called the Right to Repair, which has spawned citizens' repair workshops in several UK cities. The plan is being presented by the European Commission. It's likely to create standards for the UK, too - even after Brexit. That's because it probably won't be worthwhile for manufacturers to make lower-grade models that can only be sold in Britain. This 'Ambitious' proposal is all part of what one green group is calling the most ambitious and comprehensive proposal ever put forward to reduce the environmental and climate impact of the things we use and wear. Proposals aim at making environmentally-friendly products the norm. It could mean manufacturers using screws to hold parts in place, rather than glue. Things are slowly moving in the right direction!!

As Pete Seeger said "If it can't be reduced, reused, repaired, rebuilt, refurbished, refinished, resold, recycled or composted...then it should be restricted, redesigned or removed from production"

Iris received the "Merida" National Award of Poetry (Mexico 2009) for his book "Notebook of Dreams" and the Rodulfo Figueroa Regional Poetry award for his book "The Disguises of Fire" (Mexico 2014). Friday 27th March - **Presteigne Screen presents "Monos"** at The Assembly Rooms, 8pm. In this chilling and highly original film set in Colombia, 'monos' (monkeys) are a squad of ill-disciplined paramilitary teenagers whose real purpose is never fully explained, but whose *noms-de-guerre* (Wolf, Rambo, Dog, Boom Boom etc) suggest a frightening focus they never really live up to. They survive on both a mountain top above the cloud line, and in a dense jungle, and spend much of their time keeping teen anarchy at bay which is, of course, especially frightening for the adult prisoner they are guarding, a woman known simply as 'Doctor'. Accidents and executions are only a heart-beat away in a film that draws inspiration from *The Lord of The Flies*.

Wednesday 1st April - MBA presents "Chamber Music for Strings" at The Assembly Rooms. 4pm. Musicians from North Wales & Shropshire present an informal concert premiering two works by recent Presteigne resident, composer John Hyslop. The programme includes a string quartet and a viola trio which are influenced by traditional music forms infused with hints of Ibero-Celtic Iron Age pop music from the Walton basin circa 2500 BC !!.
