- ...from the Welsh Government. Our £500m Economic Resilience Fund will provide extra financial support to businesses and charities during the coronavirus outbreak and ease cash flow pressures. - ...(taken from an item in one of the papers, thanks John) **UK** farmers desperately need people to pick fruit and vegetables. Farms are well-practiced in training new workers, and so the only requirement is that you are 18 or over, fit, healthy, and willing to get stuck into some manual labour. The wage for fruit picking can vary between £11 an hour and £15 an hour, depending on productivity. However you should check if taking seasonal work could potentially affect your eligibility for certain benefits offered by the government during the pandemic, so check this before you apply. ...from Powys Health Board for Temporary Residents in Powys. If you are temporarily resident in Powys during Coronavirus please ensure that you continue to contact your usual GP practice for routine requests such as repeat prescriptions. Powys GP Practices, GP out of hours, community pharmacies and minor injury units will not normally process routine requests such as repeat prescriptions. They will advise you to contact your usual GP practice. Travel for medical needs to your primary residence including to visit your usual GP practice is considered "essential travel". www.powysthb.wales.nhs.uk/coronavirus
