News from the Bring Site. For those of you who were concerned about the overfull drinks carton recycling bins at the Bring Site on the Presteigne bypass, these have now been emptied. The cardboard skips are being emptied by PCC much less frequently at the moment so are often overflowing. You can help by not leaving cardboard by the side of the skips when they're full (because this blows around littering the street), and instead cutting up your boxes small enough to go in your kerbside paper & card recycling box.

- ...New 100% government backed loans have just been announced to help small businesses. No interest or repayments in first 12 months and up to 25% of turnover can be borrowed up to £50K. The scheme will open next-Monday, no projections needed just a 2 page self-certified online form. Payments should be made within 24 hours of acceptance. This could be a lifesaver for some Micro Companies even those that are eligible for grant money which wont get paid until June, this could fill a temporary gap. - ...from PCC about Free school meal allowance. As an update to providing free school meal allowance, we have been processing many supermarket vouchers which are being sent to you by email. These vouchers will be sent on a fortnightly basis, the next vouchers will be emailed to you on the 4th May 2020. For those who have opted to have a bank payment and have completed the online form on the Powys County Council website these payments are being processed and will be paid into you bank account. There is currently a back log of applications waiting to be processed, this is due to eligibility checks having to be done, please bear with us. Parents/carers will only receive either a supermarket voucher or a bank payment not both. - ...from PCC about children and young adults. We all have an important role to play in helping to protect children, young people and adults from harm.
