...from Ann. Presteigne's Swifts are back !!! having flown all the way here from Africa! They arrive now and leave early in August, spending only 3 months here with us, just long enough to breed. They bring spectacular action and excitement to our skies, with their evening fly-pasts and screaming parties. Except when nesting, they spend their lives in the air, living on the insects caught in flight. They drink, feed, sleep, find nest materials and often mate on the wing. No other birds spend as much of their life in flight. We have lost over half of our Swifts in the past 20 years. Swifts have shared our buildings ever since the Romans came to Britain. They still breed in our eaves and gables, but not for much longer, as modern and renovated buildings exclude them. The decline in insect populations is another factor, so gardening for wildlife is also important to make sure the birds have plenty to sustain them. Swift Conservation are selling record numbers of nest boxes and the Swift call CD and MP3 recordings which help to attract them to your house. So people stuck at home are thinking "Let's help Swifts! Let's get a nest box or two up and running! You can do it too! Help Swifts, help the World, make or buy nest boxes for friends and neighbours too, and keep your morale up with a nest box project!
