#### **OTHER INFORMATION**

...from the Welsh Government. Lockdown in Wales is extended for three weeks. While the first peak of infection has passed, it's too early to significantly lift restrictions. We'll make some minor changes, but maximum caution is maintained. People are being asked to continue working from home if they are able to do so. The First Minister has today announced Wales intends to make a series of small adjustments to the regulations, including [1] Allowing people to exercise more than once a day, but people should stay local. This means any exercise should start and end at home and not involve going a significant distance from home [2] Enabling local authorities to begin the process of planning how to safely reopen libraries and municipal recycling centres [3] Allowing garden centres to open provided they comply with the physical distancing duty. **...from Freegle.** We've got some good news for you - so check your email and local Freegle groups later on tonight <u>https://www.ilovefreegle.org</u>.

Tips and recycling centres are re-opening, but the government advice encourages you to use online platforms such as ours instead. Many Freegle communities are now open - although some may have restrictions or remain closed based on the local situation. **Presteigne Freegle** is one of those. We will NOT be opening just yet, pending any decision from Powys County Council on re-opening HWRCs in the county. Hereford County Council has re-opened some sites - the Leominster and Hereford HWRCs - but until Powys follows suit, we do not think it would be right for Presteigne Freegle to resume operation. Meanwhile you can still post your OFFERS, but these will be queued until that decision is made - hopefully within the next few days.

...from the Welsh Government. It was announced yesterday that a new mobile testing unit, operated by the Armed Forces, will be travelling around Powys from this week. It will launch this week as an appointment service for priority groups identified in the Welsh Government testing strategy. Specially trained Armed Forces personnel will collect swabs at the mobile sites, before they are sent to laboratories for processing.
